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# Importance of Health Care Sector

- Health services and rural development
  - Major U.S. Growth Sector
  - Business location concern
  - Retiree location factor
- 601 direct employment - 818 total employment
- \$25 million income annually - \$31.2 million total income

# Preliminary Community Concerns

- What are the major health-related concerns in Neodesha?
  - Closure of the nursing home
  - Pending retirement of the dentist
  - Drug and alcohol addiction – prevention and treatment
  - Loss of health insurance & associated preventive care
  - Use of hospital emergency room for health care
  - Child abuse and protection

# Preliminary Community Concerns

- What needs to be done to improve the local health care system?
  - Availability of a walk-in health clinic as an alternative to the emergency room
  - Strengthen the overall economic viability of rural communities

# Preliminary Community Concerns

- What should be the over-arching health care goals of the community?
  - Improve overall access to health services
  - Sustain the viability of the local hospital
  - Recruit another nursing home to keep the local elderly nearby

# Preliminary Community Concerns

- What are the greatest barriers to achieving health care goals?
  - Difficulty of recruiting visiting specialists
  - Cost and financing of health services
  - Awareness and access to available health resources
  - Cost of pharmaceuticals for lower income persons

# Data Fact Sheets

- Seeking issues/needs in secondary data
- Economic & demographic data
  - data echoes information in impact report
  - declining total population
  - remaining population aging
  - nearly 44% of population lives alone
  - 17% of HH live on <\$15,000
  - transfer income increasingly important
  - poverty typically above state average

# Data Fact Sheets

- Health & behavioral data
  - may be over-supplied with nursing facility beds – community-based alternatives?
  - youth tobacco use/binge drinking 15% to 20%
  - child immunizations only about 50%
  - 20% newborns < than adequate prenatal care
  - 17 teenage out-of-wedlock births in 2006
  - government services important to many

# Data Fact Sheets

- Crime data
  - long-term crime incidence rising
  - number of adults/juveniles arrested increasing
- Education data
  - long-term enrollment decline
  - dropout rate trending lower
  - most other trends are positive
- Traffic data
  - generally stable overall trends
  - 15% of crashes w. injury/death, no seatbelt

# Overall Conclusions from Data

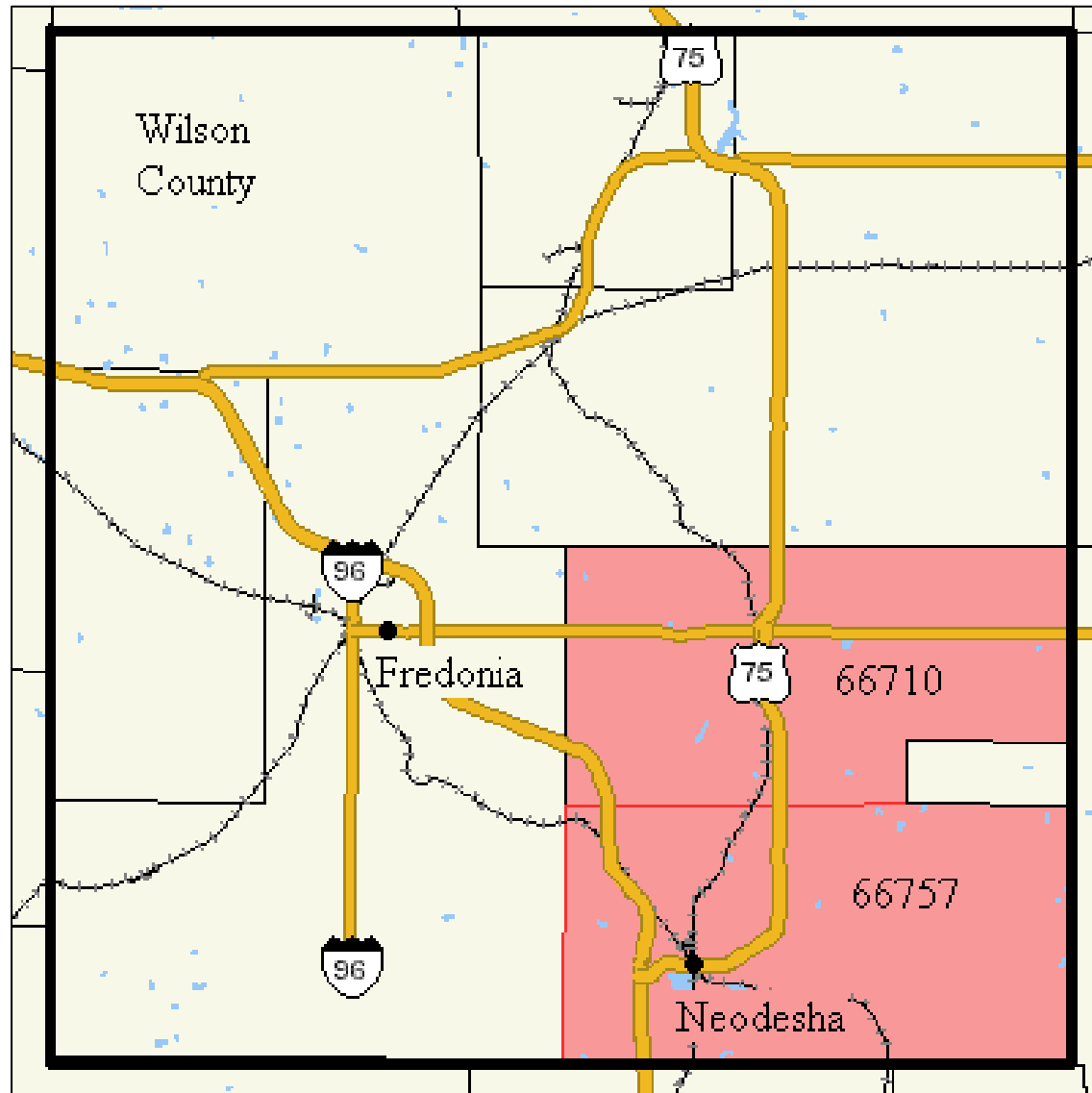
- Population trends and income levels are creating challenges
- Accessing state/federal assistance is essential
- Community-based services for those elderly, alone
- Improvement in preventable problems – neonatal care, teen tobacco/alcohol use, teen pregnancies, immunization rates
